The high percent of Jat community in this village indicate that the study village which is in Jind District is fully Jat area in Haryana. The Valmiki community possesses the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest No. i.e. 19 percent of the total populaton. Valmiki community is dominate among scheduled castes. They are well educated and better other than scheduled castes. It can be said that this community get maximum benefit of reservation policy. Chamar community numerically rank third with 9.25 percent share in the total population of the village. They are not so educated and aware towards education and their literacy rate is very low. Therefore, they could not complete for Govt. jobs as affectively as Valmiki. They live under worse condition in the village. Fourth rank of Brahman caste with 7.80 percent population share, they have small agriculture land holdings in which they grow fruits and vegetables. Their social and economic status is fairly good. Lohar community was found 5.97 percent in the village as they migrated to villages where they are not ever before to do their traditional work. Ahir community was found 5.60 percent of total population in the village. It is found that their social and economic status is not so good. Jhimmar community consists 3.66 percent population of the village. It is found that their social and economic status is not good. Eadhi community consists 3.04 percent of population of the village. Heri community is dominated among scheduled castes.

In Jat community young males are 9.68 percent and females are 8.76 percent. It is found that population of young male and female are not same in Jat community. The low percentage of young persons in Jat community show the fact that they have one and two children per family in percent generation. Adult males are 36.68 percent and females are 35.2 percent. Old males are 3.75 percent and females are 5.31 percent. In Brahman community the percentage of young males are 12.50 and females are 6.25 percent. Adult males are 37.55 percent and females are 37.55 percent. In old age males are 4.69 percent and females are 15.56 percent. In Khati community the percentage of young males are 16.27 and females are 11.62 percent. Adult males are 32.55 percent and females are 32.55 percent. In old age males are 4.65 percent and females are 2.32 percent. In Nai community the percentage of young males are 22.72 and famles are 22.7 percent. In old age males are 4.08 percent and females are 2.04 percent. In Kumhar community the percentage of young males are 23.07 and females are 7.69 percent.
